

UPDATE ON OUR PROPERTY

Congregational Meeting July 16, 2017

Approved to accept Peace River Presbytery's terms for the purchase of the property at 25250 Airport Road

Peace River Presbytery Meeting August 17, 2017

On Thursday, August 17, 2017, the Peace River Presbytery voted to convey the property at 25250 Airport Road, Punta Gorda, FL back to First Presbyterian Church of Punta Gorda, FL (ECO). With that action, a long journey to reacquire our property came to an end. Transfer of the title to the property will take place before the end of September when our lease is up. The agreement was to pay Peace River Presbytery \$165,000 and included a 15 year reverter clause that means that if we cease to operate as a church or move from our property within that period of time, the property would revert back to Peace River Presbytery. Peace River Presbytery also approved taking \$124,000 of the \$165,000 to use to help New Church Development and/or Church Redevelopment within the presbytery. They divided the remainder of the money to mission programs of the presbytery like Bethel El Mission, Cedarkirk and Misión Peniel, who will receive about \$8,000. Though not pleased with having to "buy back our property", we laud the presbytery for using the money to help others and missions rather than using it all for operations. We praise God for granting back to us the property He first gave us in 2005 so that we can continue to gather for worship and ministry, and serve our community with the love of God and good news of salvation in Jesus.






STONE FAMILY MISSION HIGHLIGHT

"Living Water Ministry"

In Eric Stone's words: "I went on a short-term mission trip with six guys from my home church in Winston-Salem to Antiqua, Guatemala to drill a well with Living Water Ministry. It made me reflect on the living water metaphor as it refers to the Holy Spirit. As I contemplated the hand pump that brings up the water from below, I considered all the implications in the adjective "living". Sure, clean water promotes life. That's not too difficult. But what makes living water a metaphor for the Holy Spirit? As I concentrated, I was reminded of 1 Corinthians 13. Anything can be "living" when motivated by the Holy Spirit and His defining agape love.

There we were, a missionary, a pair of bankers, a contractor, a retail store owner, a marketing exec. and several other professionals all compelled by the Holy Spirit to participate in this project. We were a "living" team. My hope is that each of us may recognize how much more effective for God's kingdom our lives will be if it is characterized by "living" in every aspect. I want to be a "living" husband, a "living" father, a "living" son, a "living" friend, etc. Although the concept seems logical, cut and dried, if we don't keep it at the fore of our lives considering the One who gave all for us, then we easily fall back into a routine marked by self-centeredness. May we all strive for leading truly "living" lives."
