

Let me start by expressing our deepest gratitude for your support of the Taylor family. Many of you have been following and praying for us for the better part of six years, starting with prayers of discernment whether the Lord was indeed calling us and if so, where. Looking back, it seems it was half a lifetime ago. One thing is for sure, whenever you began supporting us, we are thankful you did. Thank you for taking this journey with us, season by season. We hope that you have grown in your walk with the Lord as you have seen in our lives, the faithfulness of our Father. I speak for the entire Taylor family whan I say that because of what He has led us through, we have a much more tangible, dependable, 'real-world' type of faith. We wish the same for you.

We have reached the end of this chapter of the Taylor family story and are starting the next. We came home in July, believing that we would only be here for six months and then return to Zambia.
